Presidential Guest Speaker John Calipari

The SOA 2016 Presidential Guest Speaker is John Calipari, Head Coach of University of Kentucky Wildcats Men's Basketball. A "players-first" coach with a penchant for helping people reach their dreams, Coach Cal has guided six teams to the Final Four, led one to a national championship and helped 37 players make it to the NBA during his 23-year college coaching career.

Coach Calipari was born in Moon Township, Pennsylvania, a suburb of Pittsburgh. He played college basketball at the University of North Carolina at Wilmington before transferring to Clarion University of Pennsylvania, from which he graduated with a bachelor's degree in marketing. He has been named National Coach of the Year five times, and led Kentucky to its eighth NCAA Championship in 2012, for the first title of his career.

Calipari is a published author with several titles to his credit, including the bestsellers *Bounce Back: Overcoming Setbacks to Succeed in Business and in Life* and *Players First: Coaching from the Inside Out.*



Distinguished Southern Orthopaedist Peter A. Indelicato, MD

Peter A. Indelicato, MD is the recipient of this year's Distinguished Southern Orthopaedist award. He was born on Sept 13, 1944 in Brooklyn, New York. He went to college at Fairfield University followed by medical school at New York Medical College. He then completed his orthopaedic residency at New York University and a Fellowship in Sports Medicine at Kerlan-Jobe Clinic.

Dr. Indelicato is currently an Emeritus Professor and Head Team Physician for the University of Florida. He was a Professor for the Department of Orthopedics and Head Team Physician for the University of Florida 1977-2012. He has been an International Visiting Professor more than 12 times, including invitations to speak in Hong Kong, Bangkok, Iceland, Paris, Lyon, Innsbruck, Munich, Salzburg, Buenos Aires, Vera Cruz, Barcelona, Rome, Messina, Florence, Venice, Jukarta, Surabaya, Singapore, and Kuala Lumpur.

He was the President of the American Orthopaedic Society for Sports Medicine, 2011-2012. Dr. Indelicato has received numerous awards of recognition over the years, including the Medal of Honor at New York Medical College, Robert Cade Sports Medicine Person of the Year in 2008, National College Team Physician of the Year in 2003 and SEC Doctor of the Year in 2004. He has authored more than 100 articles and 40 book chapters.
