Presidential Guest Speaker Bruce Pearl

Bruce Alan Pearl is an American college basketball coach who is currently the head coach of the Auburn Tigers men's basketball team, where he is the school's all time leader in wins. He previously served in the same position for Tennessee, Milwaukee, and Southern Indiana. Pearl led Southern Indiana to a Division II national

championship in 1995, during which he was named Division II Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches.

In Division I, his teams have won four conference championships and four conference tournament championships, and qualified for eleven NCAA tournament appearances and one Final Four. Pearl is the second-fastest NCAA coach to reach 300 victories, needing only 382 games to reach this mark (Roy Williams needed 370 games at Kansas to reach this milestone).

Pearl was named Coach of the Year by Sporting News in 2006 and was awarded the Adolph Rupp Cup in 2008. He also served as the head coach for the Maccabi USA men's basketball team that won the gold medal at the 2009 Maccabiah Games.

Dr. Armstrong grew up in Selma, Alabama and graduated from Davidson College in 1966. He attended medical school and completed a four-year Orthopedic

Surgeon residency at the University of Alabama at Birmingham. He then served as an Orthopaedic surgeon and Chief of the Division of Orthopaedics at Kirkland Air Force Base in Albuquerque, NM before returning to Alabama.

For the next 40 years, Dr. Armstrong was a partner at Southern Orthopedic Surgeons. He is active in community service and has served on the Board of Magic Moments, as River Region Council Chairman, and as president of the Alabama Orthopedic Society & the Southern Orthopaedic Association.


