In Memory of Champ L. Baker, Jr, MD

Past President of the SOA and 2008 Distinguished Southern Orthopaedist Champ Leroy Baker, Jr., of Columbus, Georgia, passed away March 18, 2022 - at the age of 75. A celebrated orthopaedic surgeon, Dr. Baker, was renowned nationally and internationally for his expertise in sports medicine. Dr. Baker was born in Alexandria, Louisiana, on August 3, 1946, to the late Champ L. Baker, Sr. and Astrid Hiie Baker, a nurse and the inspiration for her son's medical career.

Dr. Baker received his undergraduate and medical degrees from Louisiana State University. At 6'5", he had always hoped to have a career in basketball and had, indeed, made the LSU's basketball team as a center in his freshman year. During his sophomore year, however, "Pistol Pete" Maravich joined the team as a 6'5" shooting guard. He remained the consummate LSU fan, and, ever the optimist, he supported them through good years and bad.


Dr. Baker entered the US Army after medical school and completed his orthopaedic residency at Letterman Army Medical Center in San Francisco and Shriners Hospital for Crippled Children in St. Louis. He completed a sports medicine fellowship under Dr. Jack Hughston in Columbus in 1979. He retired from the Army as a Lt. Colonel, and joined The Hughston Clinic in 1982 remaining on staff there until his retirement. He served as President of The Hughston Clinic from 1994 until 2000, and served as an orthopedics professor at Tulane University School of Medicine and at the Medical College of Georgia. He formerly served as Chair of the Board of Directors of The Hughston Foundation and as program director of the Hughston Sports Medicine Fellowship.

Dr. Baker was active in many nationally and international professional societies, and served as an officer or committee member of the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons, American Shoulder and Elbow Society, American Orthopaedic Society for Sports Medicine, American Orthopaedic Association, International Society of Arthroscopy, Knee Surgery and Orthopaedic Sports Medicine, and Arthroscopy Association of North America. He was president of the American Orthopaedic Society for Sports Medicine, Georgia Orthopaedic Society, and Georgia Shoulder and Elbow Society.

Dr. Baker was inducted into the Halls of Fame of both the Chattahoochee Valley Sports and the American Orthopaedic Society of Sports Medicine, was honored in 2010 by the latter with the George D. Rovere Award for his contribution to sports medicine education, andearned the title of "Mr. Sports Medicine" for his significant contributions to the field. He was also a recipient of the President's Challenge Award from the National Athletic Trainers Association. In short, he was the recipient of nearly every prestigious award given by the professional associations and societies to which he belonged. When jokingly asked if receiving all these lifetime achievement awards meant he was "all washed up," he replied, "Better to be all washed up with awards than all washed up with no awards."

Whether it was adding to the existing body of orthopedic knowledge or describing a new surgical technique, Dr. Baker's enthusiasm for new research projects always drove him. To pass along knowledge gained from his many years of practice, he contributed his writings to numerous medical textbooks and scientific articles on sports medicine topics. As a supporter of medical research, he served on the editorial boards of several medical journals.

In his hands-on support of athletes, Dr. Baker served as team physician for numerous local and regional athletic teams, including the University of Alabama and Columbus State University, where he was inducted into the CSU Sports Hall of Fame. He was a volunteer physician for the U.S. Olympic Committee, and started and funded scholarships for students in nursing and athletic training careers.



On a personal and local level, his community service was legendary. He was instrumental in bringing MercyMed to Columbus to provide acceible healthcare to his community's citizens. He was a Past-President of the Board of Trustees of Columbus State University, and served on the boards of many local groups. His varied interests and talents led him to contribute his time as a board member of the Bo Bartlett Center.

Dr. Baker met to his wife Sue Anne through a former LSU fraternity brother. Dr. Baker was a beloved husband and dedicated father who adored spending time with his three children. He is survived by his wife of 51 years, Sue Anne, son Champ Baker, III MD, and daughters Kate Aghevli and Sarah Andrus. He was known as "Bud" to his eight beloved grandchildren.

A service to celebrate Dr. Baker's life was held in March at St. Luke United Methodist Church. Dr. Gregory A. Mencio is the recipient of this year's inaugural L. Andrew Koman, MD Distinguished Southern Orthopaedist Award. Dr. Mencio is a graduate of Duke University School of Medicine.

He completed a two-year residency in general surgery at the University of Pittsburgh Medical Center and did his orthopaedic training at Duke University Medical Center followed by a fellowship in pediatric orthopaedics at Newington Children's Hospital (currently Connecticut Children's Medical Center).

He is currently the Neil E. Green Professor and Vice Chair of Orthopaedics at Vanderbilt Medical

Center and Chief of Pediatric Orthopaedics at Monroe Carell Jr. Children's Hospital at Vanderbilt. He is Assistant Hospital Director and Co-Chairman of the Vanderbilt University Medical Center Medical Economic Opportunity (MEOC) Committee.

His clinical interests are scoliosis and surgery of the spine, pediatric musculoskeletal trauma, limb lengthening, and management of gait and other orthopaedic aspects of neuromuscular disorders. He has been involved in resident medical education throughout his career and has been selected as a recipient of the Ken Johnson Teaching Award by the Vanderbilt Chief residents four times. He has co-authored over 50 peer reviewed articles as well as numerous book chapters and is co-editor of Green's Skeletal Trauma in Children.

He serves as a Director of the American Board of Orthopaedic Surgery and is past President of the Pediatric Orthopaedic Society of North America (POSNA) and the Tennessee Orthopaedic Society. He previously served as Chair of the American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgery Board of Specialty Societies (BOS) and was a member of the AAOS Board of Directors from 2010-2013. He served on the Advisory Board of the Annual POS-NA /AAOS International Pediatric Orthopaedic Symposium (IPOS) from 2006-2010 and on the IPOS faculty from 2005-2016.

He enjoys cycling, golf, and travel but his real passion is his wife Madelyn, and their family - daughters Alyson and Marissa and sons-in-law Ben and Andrew.

The SOA is pleased to have Zack Shinar, MD as the 2022 Presidential Guest Speaker. Dr. Shinar, MD is Vice Chair of Emergency Medicine at Sharp Memorial Hospital in San Diego, California.

He helped pioneer extracorporeal cardiopulmonary resuscitation for patients in cardiac arrests and has published extensively in the field of resuscitation. His recent paper in the Journal of Emergency Medicine has given credence to emergency physician initiated EC-MO. Dr. Shinar hosts the EDECMO podcast, co-chairs the Emergency ECMO Program, directs the ECMO/REBOA conference "Reanimate," and speaks around the world on the subject. Dr. Shinar studied medicine at the University of Southern California and bioengineering at the University of Pennsylvania. He was Chief Resident at Los Angeles County Emergency Medicine Residency. Dr. Shinar is also active in education of the youth including the Emerge the Conference Project. He is an avid endurance athlete enjoying marathons, ultramarathons, ironman triathlons, surfing and mountain biking.
